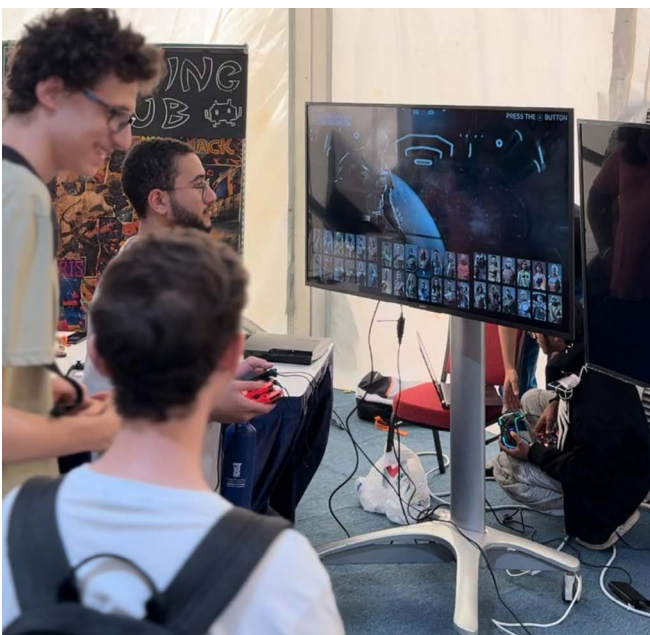

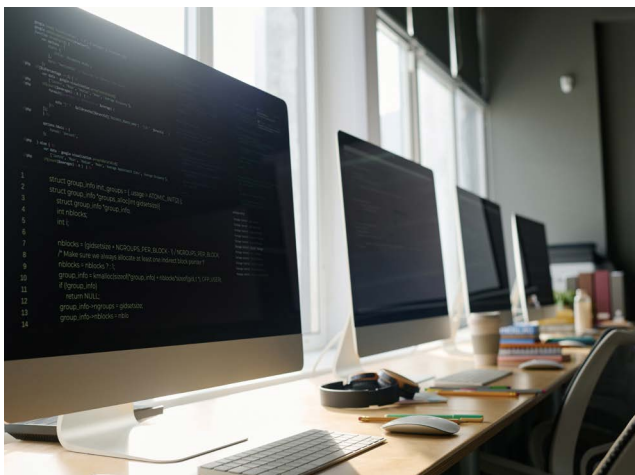


UDST Shines at Qatar Collegiate Programming Competition 2024

UDST made a strong showing at QCPC 2024 edition, with three participating teams. This year, the competition saw 44 teams from six institutions, with UDST's Team qualifying for the next level, the Africa and Arab Collegiate Programming Championship (ACPC), by solving five out of thirteen problems.

Under the guidance of coach Mr. Ghassan Alnoubani, and supported by Dr. Wagdi Alrawagfeh, and Mr. Ali Khalil, UDST teams demonstrated exceptional problem-solving skills within the intense five-hour timeframe required by the competition. The QCPC serves as the national tier of the International Collegiate Programming Contest (ICPC) and is a crucial step toward the World Finals.

UDST's qualified team will now prepare for the ACPC in December 2024, where they will face competitors from across the Arab world and Africa, with more challenging problems ahead. This accomplishment highlights UDST's commitment to fostering technical skills and excellence in programming among its students.

Financial Literacy and Entrepreneurship Workshop with Qatar Charity

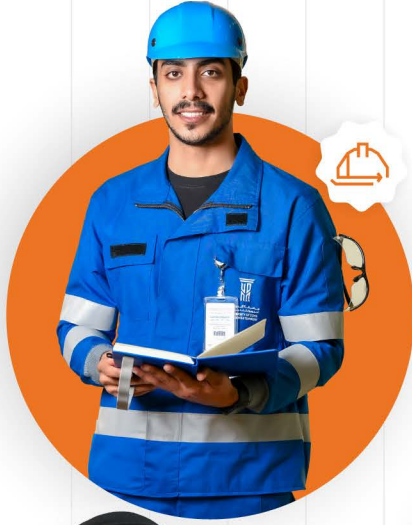
